PETRON MAKES ROADS SAFER FOR YOUNG MOTORISTS

KUALA LUMPUR - As part of its continuing efforts to promote road safety, Petron Malaysia has

launched an education campaign for university students. The program called "Safety Riding Course"

supports government initiatives and aims to promote responsible road use, prevent accidents, and

ultimately, save lives.

The program is under Petron's leading and long-running and advocacy called the "Petron Road Safety

Program."

A joint collaboration with the Road Safety Department, the Malaysia Institute of Transport, and Universiti

Teknologi Mara (UiTM), Safety Riding Course offers free practical lessons on basic driving, bike

handling, and driving ethics.

The initiative will kick-off with students from Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM), staff of UiTM and

customers of Petron stations. Participants will also have the chance to check their newly-acquired skills

through an actual driving test. At the end of the training, participants will be given a motorcycle helmet

and a Certificate of Completion.

As road safety is also about vehicle roadworthiness, students are likewise given a short course on

lubricants and the importance of regular oil change. As an added bonus, students are given free Petron

lubricants - Petron Rider 4T and 2T high-quality motorcycle engine oils.

"Targeted for university students but also open to the public, our young drivers will be trained by

experienced instructors from the Royal Malaysia Police. To date, we have already generated the interest

of around 100 students and we expect this number to grow even more as we tap other universities in the

country," En Lokman Hani, Head of Corporate Safety, Security, Health and Environment said.

Road safety is among Petron's core advocacies. It has a Malaysia-wide road safety awareness campaign

to motorists during holidays and festive seasons to promote safe driving and riding habits as well as

various motoring tips for safer journeys.
